

SUPPLEMENTAL LETTER OF AGREEMENT

BETWEEN FORDHAM UNIVERSITY

AND UNIVERSITA DEGLI STUDI SUOR ORSOLA BENINCASA

The purpose of this Supplementary Letter of Agreement (SLOA) is to set out the terms and conditions of a tuition discount agreement between Fordham University's School of Law (Fordham Law) and Università Degli Studi Suor Orsola Benincasa (UNISOB). This SLOA is to be seen as an integral part of the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between Fordham University and UNISOB.

1. No fees shall be exchanged between the institutional parties to this SLOA.
2. The parties agree that students or recent graduates from the law school at UNISOB may apply to and attend the LL.M. program at Fordham Law under the following conditions:
  - a. In order to be eligible to study at Fordham Law under the terms of this SLOA, students must be in their fourth or fifth year of undergraduate law study or in the master of laws program at UNISOB or within two years of graduation from either program (collectively hereinafter referred to as "participating students").
  - b. Participating students shall receive a tuition discount of 20% off the posted LL.M. tuition. Payment of tuition is the responsibility of each participating student.
  - c. Participating students shall be responsible for the payment of all fees normally charged to LL.M. students. Participating students will also cover all other expenses related to their study at Fordham Law, including but not limited to international and local travel, food, accommodations, books, student visas, and health insurance.
  - d. UNISOB students/graduates interested in studying at Fordham Law under the terms of this SLOA shall submit a letter of nomination from the Dean of UNISOB with their application.
  - e. UNISOB shall advise participating students that their stay in the United States shall be subject to the entry and visa regulations of the United States of America and that they shall comply with the regulations and policies of Fordham University and Fordham Law School.
  - f. Participating students are eligible to apply to any of the LL.M. programs offered by Fordham Law and may begin their studies in the fall semester (August) or the spring semester (January).
3. UNISOB agrees to make this opportunity known to its students and recent graduates through promotion on its webpage and otherwise.
4. The parties will review the terms of the SLOA annually to assess the success of the arrangement, and will determine whether to continue, modify or discontinue the SLOA. Either party may terminate this Agreement without cause at any time by giving six (6) months notice in writing to the other party. Regardless of termination, the parties shall continue to fulfill their obligations hereunder until all participants who

have commenced the program may complete the term in session at the time of termination or work that is in progress at the time of termination.

5. This SLOA shall take effect when signed by both parties, and will remain in effect through the term of the general MOU set to expire 16 December 2024, unless terminated earlier as described above.

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING  
BETWEEN  
FORDHAM UNIVERSITY  
AND  
UNIVERSITA DEGLI STUDI SUOR ORSOLA BENINCASA**

- 1) Fordham University School of Law, a not-for-profit educational institution chartered by Special Act of the Legislature of the State of New York, United States of America, with a principal place of business located at 441 East Fordham Road, Bronx, New York USA and the Università degli Studi Suor Orsola Benincasa, with a principal place of business as via Suor Orsola Benincasa 10, Napoli, 80135, Italy (hereinafter referred to as "UNISOB") hereby agree to encourage academic co-operation through research and study as stipulated below. Specific details of any activity can be set forth in a Supplemental Letter of Agreement (SLOA) which, upon signing shall become an integral part of this Memorandum of Understanding (MoU).

Purpose of the MoU:

- a) To encourage visits by faculty and students from one university to the other for the purpose of engaging in research and education;
  - b) To facilitate the admission of qualified students from one university to the other for the purpose of enrolling in undergraduate and graduate programs, and in the case of advanced graduate students, participating in research;
  - c) To foster the exchange of academic publications and scholarly information; and
  - d) To promote other academic activities which enhance the above-mentioned goals.
- 2) Both universities acknowledge that the visit by faculty and students from one university to another shall be subject to the laws of the United States of America and Italy and shall comply with the regulations and policies of Fordham University and UNISOB.
- 3) Both universities agree that all expenses, including research materials, international and domestic travel, per diem, honoraria and all other costs, shall be the responsibility of the home university and determined on a case-by-case basis. However, each side will do its utmost to make available university accommodation to visiting faculty and students.
- 4) Both universities agree to automatically renew this Memorandum of Understanding annually for a five (5) year period from the final signature date. After five (5) years, both universities agree to evaluate this MoU for future co-operation. Both universities acknowledge that this MoU is subject to revision and termination without cause at any time by mutual consent, or by six (6) months' written notice by either party.

The purpose of this Supplementary Letter of Agreement (SLOA) is to set out the terms and conditions of collaboration between Fordham University's School of Law ("Fordham Law") and the Università degli Studi Suor Orsola Benincasa, (hereinafter referred to as "UNISOB"). This SLOA is to be seen as an integral part of the Memorandum of Understanding (SLOA) between Fordham University and UNISOB

1. UNISOB may nominate students from the Faculty of Law to take part in the Fordham Law Legal English Institute in New York City for the fall semester (August-December) or spring semester (January-May). The names of the students nominated will be communicated to Fordham Law, and such students will complete and submit the online application form. Fordham Law will waive 33% of the program fee for the non-credit option of this program for such nominated students. Students electing to take the program for credit will not be entitled to a tuition discount. The nominated students will remain responsible for all other expenses associated with the program, including but not limited to travel, accommodations, visa, health insurance/health care, food, and entertainment. Fordham Law reserves the right to cancel this program for any term, or permanently, due to low enrollment.
2. UNISOB may nominate one faculty members or doctoral students each year to be Visiting Scholars or Visiting Research Fellows at Fordham Law. The names of the individuals nominated will be communicated to Fordham Law, and such individuals will complete and submit the online application form. For nominated persons who do not hold a degree from a country in which the primary language is English, Fordham Law will hold a telephonic interview to ascertain English-language ability. Fordham Law will waive the administrative fee associated with this program. Such visitors may remain at Fordham Law for up to one (1) year, and will remain responsible for all other expenses associated with the program, including but not limited to international and local travel, food, accommodations, books, visas, health insurance/health care, and entertainment. UNISOB agrees to inform about Fordham Law degree and non-degree programs through its webpage and otherwise.
3. Each participant must ensure that they have adequate health and accident insurance coverage.
4. Participants will be selected on the basis of merit without regard to race, national or ethnic origin, color, religion, age, sex, sexual orientation, marital status or physical handicap. All participants will be treated in the same non-discriminatory manner in carrying out the provisions of the MoU / SLOA, subject to the provisions of the policies and requirements of each of the institutions. Any violation of these principles will be considered grounds for terminating the MoU / SLOA.

5. Both universities appoint an individual to be responsible for complying with the terms of the agreement. For Fordham Law, that person initially is Toni Jaeger-Fine, Assistant Dean; for UNISOB, that person initially is Prof. Lucilla Gatt, Director of the Research Centre of European Private Law, as appointed by UNISOB.
6. Both universities acknowledge that any visits by students or members of one university to the other will be subject to the laws of the United States of America and Italy and that such individuals shall comply with the regulations and policies of Fordham University and UNISOB.
7. Both institutions agree to ensure that all information relating to participants and personal data will be stored securely and confidentially. Furthermore, they agree not to use or lease such information for any other purpose than the implementation of agreement.
8. The Parties will review the terms of the agreement annually to assess the success of the arrangement, and will determine whether to continue, modify or discontinue the agreement. Either party may terminate this agreement without cause at any time by giving six (6) months' notice in writing to the other party. Regardless of termination, the Parties shall continue to fulfill their obligations hereunder until all participants who have commenced the program may complete the term in session at the time of termination or work that is in progress at the time of termination.
9. This agreement shall take effect when signed by both Parties, and will remain in effect for an initial period of four (4) years, unless terminated earlier as described above.
